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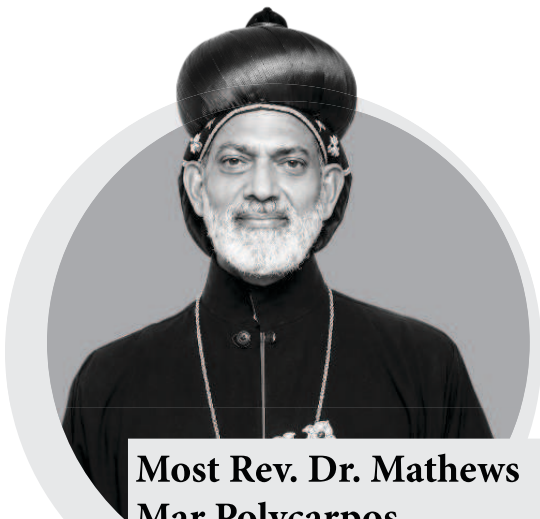

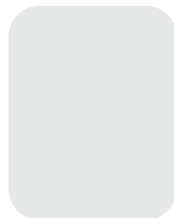

SCHOOL HISTORY

Welcome, we would like to unfold the glamorous history of our school for your kind attention. As we are getting prepared to complete five decades of commendable service, our memories take us back to the contributions of many with gratitude. The dream of Rt. Rev. P. T. George Corepiscopo to provide quality educational facilities for the children of this area was realised through the establishment of Infant Jesus Central School.

On 14 June 1974 Infant Jesus Nursery School began its journey with two teachers and 32 nursery pupils in Jain Memorial Hospital building at Thuvayoor. It was inaugurated by Most. Rev. Benedict Mar Gregorious, the Archbishop of Thiruvananthapuram in front of a jubilant crowd.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Infant Jesus Central School has been affiliated with CBSE, Delhi since 2016. The school is owned and managed by the Catholic Diocese of Mavelikara. One of the primary apostolates of the Diocese of Mavelikara is its service in the field of education. For the past 19 years, the Diocese of Mavelikara has been rendering excellent services to the society by providing quality education to thousands of students across the nation. Its goal in its educational undertakings has always been to go beyond the ordinary – striving for excellence rather than mediocrity. Through its educational institutions, the Diocese of Mavelikara has made efforts to reach all sections of the society, without compromising on quality, values, and excellence. The educational programme of the Diocese of Mavelikara is guided by strong principles and the universal values of the Gospels.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

English is the medium of instruction and should be used at all times on the school premises. Malayalam and Hindi are also taught. The management is very keen in making every student acquire skills to speak, read, write and understand English, the global language, Hindi, the national language and Malayalam, the mother tongue.

ADMISSION

- a. Registration to classes begins in the middle of October of every year. Application forms are issued from the office from October onwards.
- b. The Principal reserves the right to reject any applications without assigning any reason.
- c. Admission to other classes will be made subject to availability of vacancies in each class in the month of April after

the announcement of the annual results.

PRE-REQUISITE FOR ADMISSION

- Minimum age for Class 1 : 6 years as on 1 June.

Documents to be produced

- Birth Certificate and its copy
- Aadhaar Card copy
- Two Passport size photos

PAYMENT OF FEES

Fees are to be paid as per dates indicated in the calendar and Parents/Guardians should adhere to the concerned dates. No student will be permitted to attend the classes after the due dates without paying a fine. Fees once paid will not be refunded.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Full uniform is compulsory for all students. However, students may wear coloured dress on their birthdays, but they must wear their ID cards. On Wednesdays, students must wear special - uniform according to the colour of their school house. On the first Friday of every month, students are allowed to wear coloured dress.

SCHOOL BUS RULES AND REGULATIONS

The students can make use of the school buses for their conveyance. The route and other details can be obtained from the office. Boarding pass must be shown at the time of boarding the bus. Students with Guardians are requested to be present

at the boarding point at least 10 minutes before the departure and the arrival. No tips should be offered to the bus staff.

PRIVATE VEHICLES ARE NOT ALLOWED IN THE SCHOOL CAMPUS

Students who use hired vehicles for their conveyance other than the school buses must report the same to the class teacher, including the name of the vehicle, registration number, phone no of driver and attender. of the hired vehicles. However, the school takes no responsibility in this regard.

DISCIPLINE AND GENERAL RULES

- While moving out of the class, student should move quietly in a single line.
- Students of one class should not enter another class.
- Irregular attendance, truancy, insubordination towards teachers, habitual neglect of studies, and the use of obscene words or actions are sufficient reasons for suspension or withdrawal.
- No pupil suffering from contagious diseases will be allowed to attend class.
- The school is not responsible for the loss of personal belongings of students.
- Rubber slippers are not permitted in the school.
- No pupil will be promoted unless he/she attains 85% attendance.
- Teasing fellow students will not be allowed.
- As English is the language of communication on campus and medium of instruction, students and teachers are expected

to communicate in English inside the classroom, school premises and school buses.

- Bringing books, pamphlets, pictures and magazines that might be detrimental to educational ethics will be treated as an offence.
- Unnecessary talking or shouting inside classes or on the school campus is not allowed.
- Students are not permitted to borrow or lend money or exchange any articles.
- Change of address to be intimated to the school within a week.
- Students must come in proper uniform. The uniform should be properly washed and ironed. Shoes are to be polished daily.

PROHIBITIONS TO STUDENTS

- Smoking.
- Consumption of narcotic drugs/alcohol.
- Riding vehicles without a license.
- Engaging in physical violence with each other.
- Wearing improper dress and hairstyle.
- Being a part of any riots, chaos or fighting.
- Involvement in any kind of sexual misconduct.
- Participation in political activities.
- Using mobile phones or any electronic gadgets inside school campus.

The Principal will take serious disciplinary action against children who breach these rules and regulations.

GENERAL RULES OF THE SCHOOL

- No school business will be transacted on holidays.
- All school business will be transacted in school office only.
- Students should always keep themselves clean and tidy.
- Students should be well-dressed with clean uniforms.
- Pupils should attend the school regularly. However, if absent for any serious reason, a leave note from the parent /guardian should be submitted.
- For absence of more than 5 consecutive days, a medical certificate will have to be produced.

GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Assembly will be conducted twice every week.

ABSENCE AND LEAVE

- Regular attendance is a key requisite for a good student. So parents should ensure that their ward attends school regularly.
- No pupil may remain absent without prior written permission. In case of unavoidable absence, the student must submit a letter from the parents stating the reason, preferably in the school diary, before entering the class. For absence for more than 5 days, the parent himself must meet the Principal with the pupil.
- Absence on reopening day after the holidays will be viewed seriously.
- Absent for the sake of studying for examinations is not permitted.
- Continuous absence for 15 days or more without leave will render a pupil liable to be removed from the roll.

- Readmission, if granted will be made only after payment of readmission fee.

WITHDRAWAL OR REMOVAL

- Application in advance signed by the parents or guardians is required for withdrawing a student from the school.
- If the pupil is admitted to or withdrawn from the school in the middle of the term, Tuition Fee for the whole term should be paid.
- Transfer Certificate will be issued only after all dues are cleared and all books returned to Library.
- The Principal has the right to ask the Parent or Guardian to withdraw a child, if the child does not comply with the discipline of the school or is incapable of coping with the curriculum.
- Students can be removed from the school on any of the following grounds:
 - i. Constant weakness in studies
 - ii. Irregularity in attendance.
 - iii. Behavioural problems.
 - iv. Over age in class.
 - v. Non payment of fees or chronic irregularity in payment of fees.
 - vi. Moral breach of conduct considered serious by the school committee.

EXAMINATION

- The school conducts Periodic Tests, Half Yearly and Annual examinations during the academic year. Besides, weekly and monthly tests are also conducted regularly.
- A pupil absent from an examination or a test for any reason

will not normally be permitted a re-examination . They will be given zero for each paper they are absent for. In case of illness, a medical certificate will have to be produced.

- No candidate will be admitted to any of the examinations, unless all school fees dues have been paid in full.
- Answer scripts of all Examinations (except the final exam) will be sent to the parents for their scrutiny. Parents must put their signature and return it as early as possible. This gives the parents sufficient opportunity to watch the progress of their children.
- Copying and carrying answer slips to the examination hall will make a student liable to punishment such as detention in the same class or asked to leave the school irrespective of their academic performance.
- Suitable changes in the mode and pattern of examinations will be made when found necessary. Such changes will be intimated to the students in advance

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

- The Board of Senior Secondary Examination, New Delhi, shall conduct the examination in all subjects except General Studies, Work Experience, Health and Physical Education. Proficiency in these fields will be assessed by the School.
- In all subjects to be examined by the Board, a student will be given one paper, each carrying 80 marks for three hours and 20 marks for Internal Assessment.

PASS CRITERIA

A candidate will be eligible to get the Pass Certificate of the Board, if he/she gets a grade higher than 'E' in all subjects and the area of internal assessment. No overall division distinction aggregates shall be awarded.

CBSE EVALUATION POLICY

CBSE conducts examination for 100 marks. Out of this, 80 marks is for written test and rest 20 marks is for internal assessment. For classes 1-8, the academic year is divided into two semesters. The first is from June to October and the second semester is from November to March. A written test carrying 80 marks is conducted in each semester. And the 20 marks for internal assessment is based on

- The marks of periodic tests - 5 marks
- Multiple assessment - 5 marks
- Subject enrichment - 5 marks
- Portfolio - 5 marks

For classes 9 &10, there is no semester system. The examination is conducted at the end of the academic year.

PROMOTION

Infant Jesus Central School provides a holistic profile of the learner through assessment of both scholastic and co-scholastic aspects of education spread over the total span of instructional time. It helps to identify those positive attributes of the learner which are not usually assessed during the examination conducted by the Board.

SECTION ANIMATORS

For academic perfection, separate animators for Primary and Secondary sections are appointed

SCHOOL CREW

A team of senior students has been carefully chosen, under the direct supervision of Principal and Physical Education Instructors and appointed as school crew. They will be in charge of the general discipline inside the campus and will assist in the conduct of the extra-curricular activities of the school. A team will be put in charge of the lower section to assist the little

children during lunch time.

The crew members will be provided with identification badges, scarf and all students of the school are expected to follow the directions and instructions given by the crew members.

CLUB ACTIVITIES

To foster healthy competition in all curricular and co-curricular activities of the school, the following clubs function under the guidance of expert teachers.

SCHOOL LIBRARY

- As a consistent reading habit is essential for learning and acquiring knowledge, pupils and all members of the staff are encouraged to take maximum advantage of the school library facilities.
- Students may borrow only one book at a time for a period of one week and it can be renewed for one more week. The librarian may call for the book at any time from the borrower.
- Books will be issued to students during their designated library periods as mentioned in the Time Table, as well as before and after school hours. Please note that no books will

be issued or received during regular teaching hours.

- When a book is issued, the pupil should examine it at once and call the attention of the Librarian if any damage found in it. If he/she fails to report it on time, he/she will be held responsible for any damages detected later. The loss of book must be made, by paying thrice the amount of cost of it to the school.
- Books borrowed from the library should be kept neatly. No marking, underlining or scrubbing of any kind in the library book is allowed.
- A fine of five rupees per day will be charged for late return of a book and the fact will be noted in the defaulter's card.
- All Library books and cards must be returned before the end of February every year. Clearance from the library is required before applying the transfer certificate.

LABORATORY

- Apparatus and material may be used only in the presence of the teacher.
- Any mishap in the laboratory must be reported to the teacher immediately.
- Unauthorized experiments are not allowed.
- Breakage and faults of all kinds should be reported. All apparatus must be kept clean
- after use.
- Breakages are to be compensated by pupil.
- Avoid all kinds of wastages.
- Perfect silence should be observed inside the laboratory.

PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICE AND STUDENTS' CARE CENTRE

The School has a Public Relation Office and Students' Care Centre to look into the students' affairs and help them to explore all possible opportunities. Qualified and experienced staff work in these offices. The main aims are the following:

- To give proper guidance to the students as well as parents regarding education.
- To care for pupils suffering from any illness or other problems during the school time.
- To provide proper guidance to the pupils who are below average in studies.

PARENT-TEACHER MEETING

- Keeping in mind that sincere cooperation of the parents with the school makes true education, PTA meetings are conducted for each division and class separately every year.
- All parents are requested to take active interest in the activities of PTA and ensure smooth running and progress of the institution in which they have entrusted their children.

DEAR PARENT

Thank you for entrusting your child to us.

- The school insists on punctuality, regular attendance, good manners, cleanliness and dedication to studies. Above all, a student must be courteous to superiors and fellow students.
- No student is permitted to leave the school premises without the permission granted by the Principal or Vice-Principal and only upon a written request from the Parents.
- Students are responsible for the safe custody of their books

and other belongings.

- No valuable articles or money should be brought to school.
- Parents/Guardians are requested to remain within the designated visitors' area and are not allowed to enter classrooms or cross beyond the designated point. Meetings with teachers during class hours are not permitted.
- All Students are expected to strictly follow the instructions given by the class teachers through the Prefects and Class leaders.
- Parents are requested to check the Diary and school bag of the children every day and ensure that instructions are being followed by their children properly.
- Students are expected to converse in English while they are in and around the school Campus.
- The Principal has the right to suspend or withdraw any student without stating a reason, provided the Principal is convinced that such a step is necessary for the interest of the school.
- Kindly follow the Rules and Regulations and co-operate with us for the smooth functioning of the school.

DEAR STUDENTS

- Concentrate on your integral development and utilize all the facilities provided for your progress.
